WHO WAS TAVENAR RUCKER OF GREENBRIER CO., WV?

Pauline McFarlin wrote me recently and wanted to know the father of her ancestor Tavenar Rucker of Greenbrier County, (West) Virginia. She said she didn't have much response to her query in a previous issue of the Rucker newsletter. She did confirm the spelling of his name as Tavenar as opposed to the many other spellings that have been used: Tavenar, Tavenor, Tavernor, Taverner, Tavenner, Tavanor, Tabnor, and Tavner.

In Sudie Rucker Wood's *Rucker Family Genealogy*, p.247, it said "Tavener" Rucker (William, William, Peter) went to Greenbrier Co., W. Va. He paid a personal tax from 1796 until 1816. This was actually two mistakes as this "Tavner" moved from Amelia Co., VA, to Elbert Co., GA, and never went to Greenbrier at all. The other mistake is that Tavenar began paying taxes in Greenbrier County in 1802, not 1796.

On p.243, Sudie listed the tax records for William Rucker. It said in the 1789 personal tax records of Culpeper Co., VA, "William Rucker paid on Taverner [sic] and Benjamin." The author looked up the records at the Library of Virginia and it indeed does say that. William paid on

Tavener in 1789, and an unnamed son in 1790, 1791 and 1792. Benjamin paid for himself in 1790 and 1792. Also in the same 1789 tax records, William Rucker, son to Thomas paid, indicating that the William that paid on Tavener and Benjamin was the son of William. But how could this be?

The first problem is there were two Tavenar Ruckers, one who lived in Georgia and one who lived in Greenbrier Co., (W)VA. The second problem is the two William Ruckers, one was the son of William, and the other the son of Thomas, both grandsons of Peter Rucker, immigrant. Both Williams were approximately the same age and lived in the same area of Culpeper/ Madison Co., VA. How can we tell them apart in the records? We can understand how easy it was to confuse them so that even the tax collectors had trouble identifying them.

The law said every white male at the age of 16 had to pay a tax and this was usually done by the parent unless the child was living on his own. If William (son of William) paid on son "Taverner" in the 1789 tax records, logic tells us the son would have been over the age of 16. Tavner Rucker of Georgia was

born January 12, 1787 (family Bible record), making him two years old in 1789. How can this be? Even if he was born in 1777 as Sudie guessed, he would have been only 12. And who was Benjamin? William's Will listed no son named Benjamin.

Tavenar Rucker began paying his own tax in Culpeper beginning 1794, then the county name changed to Madison. He paid in Madison until 1800 when his name disappears. A "Tavenar" Rucker began paying tax in Greenbrier County in 1802. This leads us to believe that the Tavenar of Culpeper/ Madison was the same one that moved to Greenbrier County.

This has been very confusing to us. The only answer is the William Rucker that paid taxes on Tavenar and Benjamin was the son of Thomas, not William.

The Tavenar Rucker family Bible, found at the Franklin, TN, library, spelled the Georgian's name "Tavner." The 1850 Franklin Co., GA, census said he was 64 years old which matches the 1787 birth date given in the Bible. Tavner and Elizabeth Wade married about 1820, not 1798 as Sudie said on p.247. The family Bible, doesn't give their date of marriage, but does give the birth dates of their children, beginning August 21, 1822.

We have to distinguish between the two William Ruckers: William Long Nose and William Jaw Bones. Sudie on p.243 and p.229 does a good job of this. I think William, son of William, was called Junior because he was the son of William. Possibly he was considered younger because his children were much younger.

1. William³ (Thomas², Peter¹) was called Senior, "Jaw Bones" or J. Bones.

2. William³ (William², Peter¹) was called Junior, "Long Nose" or L. Nose.

Now we can identify their most distinguishing feature, let's look at their children as listed in their Wills.

William's (son of William²) dated 5 Aug 1833, listed: Barden, Tavenar [sic], William, Frances Jones, and heirs of Elizabeth Childs and Lemuel Rucker.

William's (son of Thomas²) dated 20 May 1818, listed: Joel, Benjamin, Jarvis, Fannie, Eleanor, Sally Warren and Nancy Carter.

As the author continued to examine the tax records of Culpeper and Madison, she discovered that William (son of Thomas²) J. Bones was listed near Benjamin, Tavenar, Joel, and eventually Jarvis. William (son of William²) L. Nose was listed alone. This was a great clue.

Note that both Williams were married to an Elizabeth. William (son of Thomas²) was married to Elizabeth Smith. He died in Madison county, VA. William (son of William²) L. Nose moved to Georgia. His wife was Elizabeth Alexander, daughter of James Alexander and mentioned as such in his will. William's first child, Barden was born in 1785 and he was never mentioned in the Virginia tax records. William Long Nose disappears from the records in 1804, so probably moved away at that time. William's children were not listed in the tax records of Culpeper county because they were not old enough. Remember, it was

not like getting a driver's license today, no one rushed down to pay on their son when he came of age. They only did so when forced to do it.

Query: Who was the father of Tavenar Rucker of Greenbrier county? The author thinks it was William (son of Thomas)!!!! Consider the following: 1. William Rucker paid a tax on Tavenar and Benjamin and we know William (son of Thomas) had a son named Benjamin; 2. Tavenar died in 1816 the year his estate paid his taxes in Greenbrier County (was that why he was not mentioned in his father's will); and 3. Tavenar had one son, named "William" after his grandfather.

The only other question that still looms on the horizon is why did Tavenar move to the area of Greenbrier County where his uncle James Rucker lived? William (son of Thomas) had a son Joel that moved to Bath county and a daughter that married a Rucker cousin in Greenbrier County. So there were relatives in the area.

SPRING CLEANING IN AMHERST COUNTY, VIRGINIA

The Rucker graveyard on Graham Creek has been spruced-up, again. A visit last summer found it almost impenetrable, particularly for those sensitive to poison ivy. Over the course of several weekends this winter and spring, brush was removed, vines cleared, and stumps shortened to permit entry and inspection of the nine stones described by Sudie Rucker Wood (p.80). The author suggests interested readers visit soon, before summer growth returns;

carry a bottle of weed killer, and treat anything green.

One new stone in the cemetery honors the Confederated service of Ambrose⁷ Clark Rucker (Edwin⁶ Sorrell, Ambrose⁵, Reuben⁴, Ambrose³, John², Peter¹). "Long Ambrose" died April 20, 1891, and his obituary said he "was laid away in the family cemetery." Several other members of his family probably are buried there in unmarked graves. His stone was placed to the left of that of his first wife, Philadelphia Catherine Clark (listed as Kate P. Rucker). Wood's claim of his service in Co. E of the 2nd Virginia Calvary may have been wrong: the author's research suggests that he took exemption from duty based on his positions as a slave owner and mail contractor.

(Ambrose⁵, Reuben⁴, Ambrose³, John²) cemetery in Pleasant View has also been restored. The photo above is before restoration and the one below is after.



The cemetery is located on the property of the Mays Family, who graciously assisted with the project. The stones were repaired and reset, and a fence built to exclude the curious cattle. The sunken graves described by Wood (p.49) are no longer so evident, but some can be seen after a highlighting snowfall, or when Spring daffodils mark the few remaining fieldstones.

Just one hill to the southwest, the Confederate gravestone of Godfrey Toler Rucker (Alexander, Marr, Richard, Isaac John) was unexpectedly discovered, and uncovered from a particularly impassible blackberry thicket. An old iron fence has been propped up, and there appear to be other graves, some marked by fieldstones. Don't miss the very old log home further up the hill. No dates are on Godfrey's stone but he died between his will dated December 8, 1888 and its probate December 16, 1889. Please contact the author with any specifics.

Those who enjoy stumbling through woods and pastures searching for graves and homesteads know that it is often difficult to find them again, sometimes years later. The author suggests using a Global Positioning System unit, now moderately priced. Unlike street names and property owners. latitude and longitude never change. (Godfrey can be found on the U.S.G.S. "Tobacco Row Mtn." map at 37°37.62 N, 79°14.42 W).

Grand Mother.

D.F. Rucker, Son of S. J. William
Joseph [Jasper] Rucker and R.J.
[Rhoda Jane Allen-Rucker] Rucker.
'Jasper' was my Grandfather John
Martin Rucker's oldest brother.
Jasper was born 29 Feb 1852 in
Arkansas; Died 4 June 1901;
married Rhoda Jane 11 Oct 1874.
She was born 1 Jan 1859 in Van
Zandt Co. TX., and died 3 Nov
1910. Both are buried in
Providence cemetery. They are
also listed on the titled report.

Horace M. Rucker, Mary Ophelia
Rucker, Leonard J. Rucker, and
Infant Son are all children of my
maternal Grand-parents, John
Martin Rucker and Ara Virginia
Peters-Rucker. J.M. (John Martin)
was born 6 Feb 1861 in Van Zandt
Co. TX.; He died 7 Dec 1938 at
Decatur, Texas. Ara Virginia
Rucker was born 13 Sept 1865 in
Smith Co., TX. and died 4 Jan
1944, also Decatur, Texas. Both
are buried in the Oaklawn
Cemetery at Decatur, Texas. They
were married 2 June 1882 and the
unnamed infant was born and died
after Horace Milam, and before
Lorena Rucker, who was born 24
Aug 1893, in Wise Co., TX.

My Grand-Father, John Martin

Rucker told my mother, Izetta
Rucker-Toten that they moved from
Van Zandt Co. to Wise Co., TX,
because the water was so bad in
Van Zandt it killed the first
four children before they were
old enough to fend for them-
selves.

Mrs. N. C. Rucker, 14 July 1855/6
- Sept 1937 was (Nancy Carralin
Andrews-Rucker) wife of James
Franklin Rucker, an older brother
of Frank W. Rucker.

Calvin Rucker, 18 Dec 1882-23
July 1884, was Nancy Carralin
Andrew's, and James Franklin
Rucker's son.

Iva Delena Rucker-Allen, 2 Sept
1880-19 Sept 1952, was a daughter
of James Franklin and Nancy
Carralin Rucker. She married
Virgil Allen on 26 Sept 1897.
Their Son married Charlotta
Berneatha Tuttle-Allen, an
esteemed author, and member of
the Rucker Family Society.

Searching for descendants of SAMUEL RUCKER. Samuel was born abt 1832-33 in Greenbrier Co., [W]VA, son of Frances Rucker. He appeared in the 1850 census in Allegheny and Greenbrier Counties. In 1860 he appeared as a laborer in Allegheny Co. for a farmer. In late 1859 or early 1860 Samuel Rucker married Barbara Stonestreet.

2. John W. P. Rucker b. 17 Sep 1862, in Bath Co., VA

Soon after William was born

Barbara Rucker died and her death is documented in Barbour Co., WV.

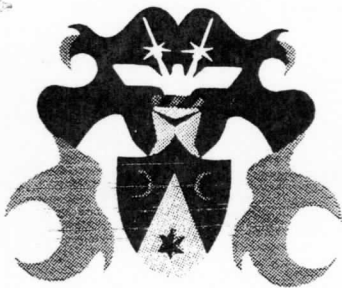
